WORKSHOP WITH TEREZKA



Sydney performer and teacher Terezka Drznik is returning to Brisbane September 25-26 to conduct a weekend workshop.

Terezka's career in Oriental Dance spans 20 years. In that time she has performed regularly overseas and locally, taught both weekly group class, and given private instruction to some of Australia's finest dancers who are now pursuing their own directions in the dance.

Terezka is Principal and founder of The School of Danse Orientale - one of Australia's longest running schools devoted to Oriental Dance and Middle Eastern culture.

Terezka's September workshop (25th/26th) will be held at O Block, Qut Campus, Kelvin Grove, Brisbane. Workshop session topics, a widely varied program, include Indian/Arabic and Zaar, Drum Solo, Traditional Khaleegy, Shaabi & Saidi.

Terezka will perform to live music Sunday evening at a special "Egyptian Dance Party" to live music at BEMAC. Gates open 6.30pm. There will be a program of dance performance and music. Opening this event is a bellydance fashion parade by Pathedy Bellydance Fashions at 7pm. There will be stalls selling bellydance items, and food will be available.

Profiling Shahara



Brisbane born dancer Sharon Daley (Princess Shahara) credits her early experiences travelling throughout the world as the catalyst for her career in both bellydancing and antiques. Sharon says she was a restless teenager, taking off to tour Australia for a year, before marrying at 18 years of age and travelling to Canada with her husband. From there they went on to England and Europe and adventurously travelled on a miniscule budget. They visited India, Katmandu, Afghanistan, Iraq, Iran, Turkey, Indonesia and south east Asia subsequently returning to Australia. During these travels Sharon acquired knowledge of antiques and art works,

which she utilized to earn a living after her daughter Bianca was born and the marriage broke down. Sharon's antiques business "Secondhand Rose" was a landmark in the Toowong area for ten years.

A passionate collector of anything with camels on it, Sharon's home is decorated with items from paintings to carvings to leather depicting the "ships of the desert."

Sharon made many return trips to Africa, and the Middle East (Egypt,



Morocco, Tunisia etc) along the way coming to appreciate Middle Eastern art, music and dance.

Sharon began studying Middle Eastern Dance with Susan Buntine in 1990. Sharon joined the Academy's main performing troupe in 1991, and started teaching her own classes in 1991. Sarah-Jane Schramm, and current Oasis dancers Alesa Layana, Eva Kovacs, and Karen Herber are all past pupils of Shahara

Sharon further studied with master teachers in Perth, and Sydney, and at Brisbane's Annual Winter Warm-Up. Shahara has performed at Bellydance Festivals around Australia, and a variety of venues around Brisbane including 5star hotels, and restaurants, and is much sought after for private parties. Children's parties are one of her specialities - with just that little touch of fantasy.

CHILDREN'S CLASSES WITH PRINCESS YASMINI

Having received a number of enquiries for Middle Eastern Dance class for children, Princess Yasmini (Susan Buntine) is pleased to announce that new classes suitable for both boys and girls will commence 4th October at Jagera Arts Centre, 121 Cordelia Street, South Brisbane from 4 to 4.45pm (Mondays).

Yasmini is an Educational Psychologist and University Trained Dance Teacher, and a mother of two young sons.

Enrolling your children in bellydance classes is a fun way of improving their co-ordination, fitness, flexibility, literacy skills, bone density (reducing risk of later osteoporosis), and strength. In Middle Eastern Dance size and shape do not matter. Many parents discover their child's size and body shape does not suit some other forms of dance.

Children enjoy the creativity and self expression of Middle Eastern Dance and this helps boosts their confidence and self esteem, building towards a well rounded personality.

Children are able to decide their own level of participation in Middle Eastern Dance - some just like to learn and mingle with others in a fun class, and there are those who wish to go further by performing at specially chosen events.

Class term is 8 weeks and the cost is \$50 per term.
